#### Member Interview Lynn Sarkis

Whenever you're volunteering for or attending one of LAA's member shows, you're likely to find Lynn Sarkis nearby. Her experience with producing these shows, added to her rich list of talents and skills, makes her an ideal person to be on the Show Coordinating Team (composed of Kirk Fry, Dawn Hendrix and herself). Lynn knows how to hang art, adjust lights, and set up show spaces. She knows all about the work behind the scenes that makes any show a success. Her current role on the Show Coordinating Team entails making sure the Arts Center space is reserved, providing information and assistance to the members producing any particular show, ordering award ribbons, procuring show budget from the Board for those spending the money, and working with Board Liaisons on behalf of the production teams. A bit about Lynn's background will help you understand why she is such a valuable asset to LAA.

Born into a family with six children, Lynn's early life was spent on a farm in rural north central Missouri. Here she learned early about hard work and resilience. Because opportunities were limited in such a remote location, as soon as she finished high school, Lynn moved out to Denver to seek her fortune. Her first job at age 18 was at the Colorado Department of Motor Vehicles coding traffic violations in a large, tightly structured environment for very low pay. Since this type of work soon becomes boring for anyone with ambition, Lynn figured out how the system worked, and with her supervisor's help, got promoted. Later, she worked for Community Colleges of Denver in the Registrar's office and when big layoffs resulted in her job's elimination, she took an exam and moved on to Colorado Employment and Training. Here she worked as a "Batch Girl" processing unemployment applications for keypunch/ processing on mainframe computers. Next was a job move into Information Systems (both hardware and software) for the State, which was situated downtown on Capitol Hill. Lynn has many amusing anecdotes about working in that part of Denver, including tales about her wonderful, quirky boss who became a great mentor.

It was the early 1980's when mainframe computers were being replaced with personal computers. Lynn was given one to take home, and though she tried to learn programming, it didn't suit her. She moved to Boulder and commuted by bus to work in Denver. In Boulder, Lynn took up rock climbing, which at that time was dominated by men. A boyfriend told Lynn she wouldn't like climbing, but this made her more determined than ever to get good at it! Within the climbing community, Lynn met Charlie Sarkis, her future husband and life partner. They married in 1988, and have enjoyed many shared outdoor and travel adventures over their 34 years together. Charlie is a climber, biker, traveler, hiker, and woodworker. He is a contractor by trade, and Lynn sometimes assists on his projects, especially since her own retirement.

When Lynn grew tired of her daily three hour bus commute to Denver, she accepted a job at the University of Colorado in Faculty Personnel where she verified data on all faculty records. She began taking classes at Red Rocks Community College in computer hardware systems and found she enjoyed taking things apart and troubleshooting. Later on, an opening came up in the CU Chemistry Department where Lynn started small but went on to practically run the department. She was department secretary, building manager, payroll administrator, Environmental Health and Safety Manager, and much more for twenty years until retirement.

As a young girl, Lynn always enjoyed doodling and had a great art teacher at school who encouraged her to try many things while never judging anyone or anything harshly. Like many girls of her era, Lynn learned to sew early and was taught quilting by her grandmother. Since retiring, Lynn has taken many workshops which have

helped inspire and direct her art. At times, a workshop can reignite her interest in a project already underway, or can challenge her to try a different direction. Charlie has been a pivotal force encouraging Lynn's development as an artist and cheering her on. The culmination of these various influences can be seen in the unique fabric art she creates now, along with her watercolor paintings.

Lynn's fabric art pieces have won several awards in LAA shows. Most recently her piece *The Good Dog* won People's Choice at the 2022 Spring Members' Show. Last year a fiber art piece won an Honorable Mention at the juried LAA National Fine Arts Show. In 2018 Lynn had a painting juried into the Colorado Watercolor Society Show, and she has had a couple of watercolor paintings juried into LAA's National Fine Arts Show. She says she doesn't enter many shows because she's still somewhat insecure about her work, but this impressive track record of awards indicates these insecurities are unfounded. Go, Lynn!

Lynn hopes to see LAA return more to its roots of being a stronger community for artists. The pandemic and other challenges have resulted in a somewhat fractured organization. She herself aims to collect the bits and pieces of herself which have been given away by spreading her time too thin. **- Jane Elvins**
