#### Member Interview Jane Evans

When she was President of LAA from 2010-2015, she often joked about using her "kindergarten teacher's voice" to call the group to order during monthly member programs. As funny as that sounded, it worked! Her many talents and skills, enabled her to get the group's attention and to apply some practices from teaching children to gently persuade us to do things that needed to be done. Apparently, our elementary school selves' responses were still there waiting to be reactivated! For those who have been in LAA for a while, you probably know Jane Evans. For newer members, if you haven't yet met Jane, you probably will soon since she continues to be integrally involved with our organization. This year, for example, Jane is the organizer of LAA's part in the annual Taste of Louisville event held each June. She is also the lead organizer of the annual Youth Show held at Louisville Library each March. She is the lead organizer of LAA's plein air group, Plein



Janes/Joes, which meets every Wednesday morning at a different location from May through October. And, Jane publishes organizationally-relevant news on LAA's Facebook page.

How did Jane get to be such a dedicated volunteer? A brief look at her beginnings may shed light on that. She was born and raised in Willow City, North Dakota, population 100. This tiny farming community is very isolated, situated close to the Canadian border and 15 miles from the nearest town. Due to its very small size, Jane's school district had no sports teams (not enough students to make up teams), but was very focused on music and performance. A small, tight-knit community means high individual visibility, responsibility and interdependence. One must bring honor onto his/her family there, and will be encouraged to go to college and pursue as much success as possible.

Jane's parents had two daughters, so Jane was assigned to help her father with the farming, while her sister was expected to perform the inside duties alongside her mother. Her mother often worked in the fields, leaving her younger sister to prepare all the meals and take care of the home. Both sisters worked hard, as did their peers in the community. Even in her retirement years, Jane is no stranger to hard physical work and is dedicated to building and maintaining community.

After high school, Jane went to the University of North Dakota – Grand Forks where she majored in music. Her father's focus on practical concerns led Jane to also gain credentials in elementary education and K-12

music education. During those college years, Jane met her life partner Russ. After graduation, Russ and Jane married and moved to Colorado, where Russ pursued his career with Rocky Flats as a research engineer. Jane was hired by Boulder Valley School District teaching music. As her own two daughters came along, Jane's creativity was directed toward projects done at home with her kids and their friends. Her introduction to visual arts was a college course, but she was too busy with other things to pursue painting until she retired from school teaching.

Having tucked away a goal to get into visual arts when she had time, Jane started studying with Donna Flebbe, who soon thereafter introduced Jane to LAA. Jane was invited to serve on the LAA Board of Directors where her love for LAA took root. She was on the Board of Directors for a year, then served as Vice President for two years, and next moved on to serve as President for four years. In all of her volunteer roles, Jane was rewarded through associations with lots of fun people with interesting backgrounds, and an ongoing sense of community among artists and between artists and the surrounding communities of Louisville, Lafayette, Boulder, Broomfield and beyond.

Involvement in LAA has made Jane's life richer, she reports. Through participating in many workshops, dabblers, shows, community-building events, interfaces with local government, and internal LAA governance roles, she has grown immensely as a person and as an artist. These experiences have stretched her in innumerable ways, and she strongly recommends to all members to fully take part in LAA.

These days, along with her four volunteer roles for LAA, Jane finds time to spend with her granddaughters and her adult daughters with spouses, travel with her husband Russ, perform caretaking tasks at the family homestead in North Dakota, and grow her own large vegetable and flower gardens at home in Louisville!
