We won't usually announce any cancellations for weather, though we may formally cancel if it's a major weather event. We will paint from 9:00–12:00 unless otherwise specified, but you are encouraged to come and go according to your own needs. PJ's is free and welcomes all levels of painters, sketchers, photographers. Come join us.

JUNE 2024 Schedule

June 5th – Pella Crossing, Hygiene – 1600 N 75th St, Longmont 80503 – From the Diagonal Highway (CO 119), exit at Monarch Rd. and go west to where it crosses N. 71st St. Follow N. 71st as it curves around to the northeast and crosses N. 73rd St. Then drive N. 73rd as it curves around to the northeast past Lagerman Reservoir and becomes N. 75th St. Stay on N. 75th as it crosses Nelson Rd. and St. Vrain Rd. and ends up at Pella Crossing. This wetlands habitat was wiped out in the 2013 flood but has been restored as a home for many mammals, amphibians, birds, and fish. On site are picnic tables, shelters, a parking lot and restrooms. There are many varieties of grasses, trees, and wildflowers around the wetlands.



June 12th – Longmont Memorial Rose Garden – Roosevelt Park, 700 Longs Peak Ave. – At the west end of this large park, hundreds of roses bloom in the summer. The park has large trees, restrooms, sculptures, park stuff. Roses do need sunshine to thrive, so bring your umbrella if you want to get close., many are in flower beds with trees surrounding them. Park along Bross Street, between Longs Peak Ave. and 8th Ave.



June 19th – Steinbaugh Pavilion Historic Louisville – 824 Front St, Louisville 80027 – This will be our meeting point. From there you can visit 740 Front restaurant or go to Main Street, where there are many venues, such as Moxie Bread and Huckleberry restaurant. The decks are out with umbrellas and flower boxes. A lovely street scene. At noon let's meet back at the pavilion to visit and have a sack lunch.



June 26th – Sandstone Ranch Park – 3001 CO-119, Longmont 80504 – Take 287 or 119 to Longmont. Where 119 and 287 intersect, head east on 119 (Ken Pratt Blvd.) past the intersection of Weld County Road 1. A half mile past WCR1, look for ball fields and King Chevrolet. Turn right there and drive past a large parking lot, then continue to the Visitors' Center where you'll find a smaller parking lot. The ranch features shade trees, old buildings, mountain views, and beautiful SW rock formations.
